WALKING THE ROAD TO BENEFIT CANCER RESEARCH

Washington, PA— The Historic National Road is still a corridor for new beginnings. Historically, families found new opportunities by travelling west. Today, Dave Brown, a modern pioneer, is on his 26 day walking across America to benefit the ovarian cancer research fund. Two years ago, Dave's wife Joan lost her battle with ovarian cancer. His journey is about raising awareness. His goal is to raise \$100,000 for the Ovarian Cancer Research Fund.

Dave's route is Atlantic City to San Francisco. He will follow US 40 and US 50, but as many of us know, in the east US 40 is the Historic National Road.

On day 19 of his journey, he reached Cumberland, Maryland the start of the National Road. He has been steadily walking west about 14-15 per day. He is expected to arrive in Indiana in mid-April. Indiana will welcome Dave with open arms. GREENFIELD DEDICATION

Greenfield—Greenfield, Indiana and the Indiana National Road Association (INRA) will hold a brief public dedication of a new interpretive panel celebrating the Historic National Road (US 40) at Noon, on Friday, April 12. The dedication will take place outdoors at the Southwest corner of US 40 and State Rd. 9, (immediately adjacent to the Greenfield City Government Building) and feature brief remarks by Mayor Richard Pasco and local historian, author, and INRA Board Member, Joe Skvarenina. In the event of rain, the dedication will be held indoors at the Greenfield City Government building, main floor, City Council Chambers.

Including the panel in Greenfield, INRA has installed a total of 15 interpretive panels along the Historic National Road from Richmond to Terre Haute. Each panel features unique information for tourists and residents about the history and significance of the Historic National Road across Indiana. Additional dedications are being coordinated for the remaining panels across the state.
